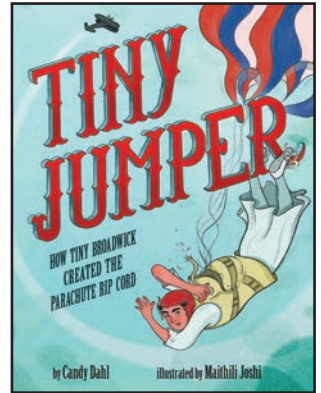


# MAZE

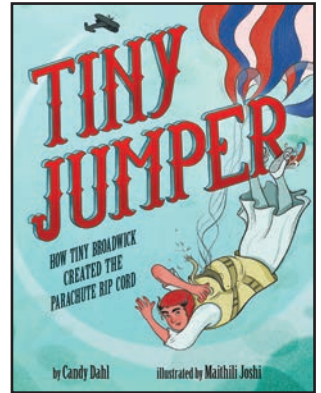

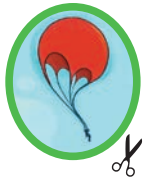
Tiny Broadwick was the first woman to parachute from an airplane and she created the parachute rip cord. Explore her amazing life with this fun game for two players.

If you land exactly on a space with directions, follow the prompt. You must land exactly on the "Winner!" space to end the game.

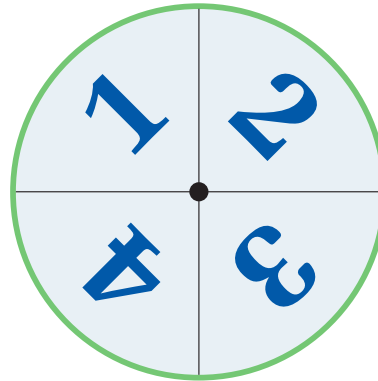
Cut out your playing pieces.

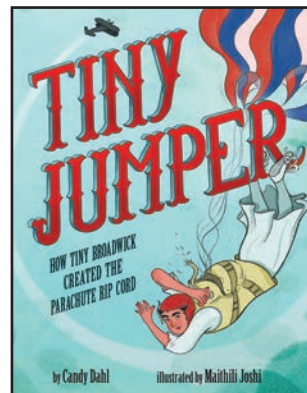

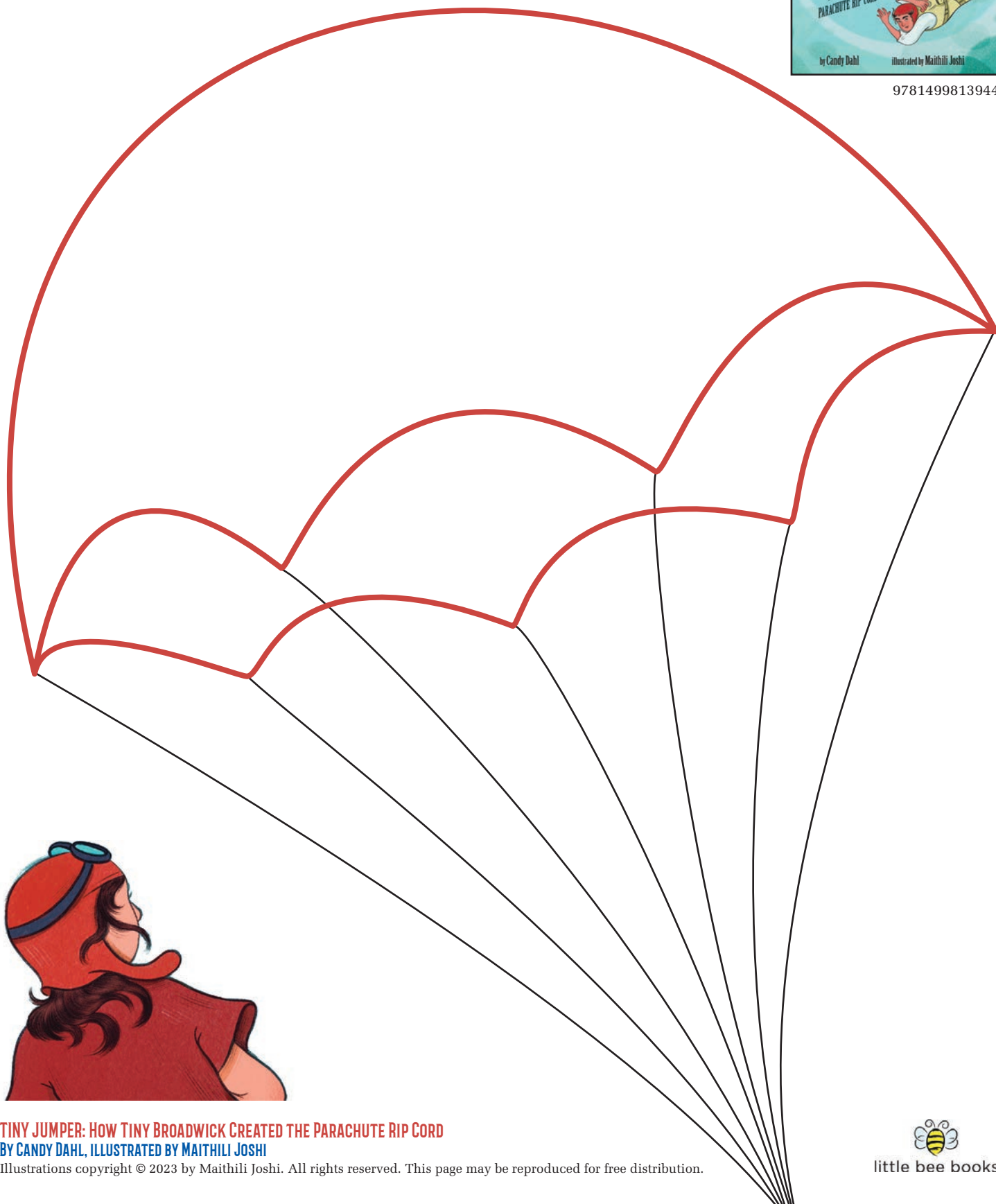
